## DISCUSSION:

## ANDY KEISER

Crispin - Opening Bids for construction of Pavilion. Walter Buildings lump sum building and construction bid is \$108,582.00. Electrical is \$25,905.00. Total Bid price is \$134,487.00. FS Construction Service lump sum building and construction bid is \$108,980.00. Electrical is \$22,225.00. Total bid price is \$131,205.00. Keiser – the bid is over the grant you have for \$100,000.00. You will have to decide where the extra money will come from. Crispin – We have \$87,669.75 left on the grant. I also need to find out how much I can spend out of the Park budget. I will make a motion to table the Bid Award until next meeting so I can review the budget. Keiser – since we combined the bid, we would award it to the apparent low bidder which would be FS. Then we would change order out the electrical at \$22,225.00 so the bottom line is \$108,980.00. You have to award it on the total bid price and then change order it out.

## LUCAS KNIGHT

Commercial Insurance for 2021. Knight gave a general overview of the HCC Public Risk policy. No questions were asked by Council. Council voted to accept policy as written.

#### **COMMISSIONER CHANEY:**

Chaney – let's get the jobs posted on Facebook and I will start interview this week.

#### **COMMISSIONER CRISPIN:**

#### **COMMISSIONER HADDIX:**

Gavin McClamroch raise – Burns – last meeting minutes say to raise him up with the other workers at next meeting. Wolfe – it didn't say to \$16.00 per hour. Mayor asked McClamroch if he was working Sewer and Water. McClamroch just the sewer plant. I am not sure what I am supposed to be doing. Haddix – I am in favor of raising him to \$15.00 per hour. Wolfe – are we going to make him a floater? Crispin – When I hired my guys, they had experience. That's why I hired them at that salary. I'm not saying he doesn't have experience. He's fresh out of High School which nothing against that. But as far as the workforce, I'd be alright at \$14.00 with the incentive of getting his license. Haddix – He is not new here. He worked the COOP summer program for two years Crispin – what does Gavin think? McClamroch – I didn't know what I was supposed to do for the last two weeks. I've asked Commissioners, but it is hard to get in touch with some of you guys. But I have asked what are my job responsibilities because I have been trying to figure this out for myself. I am willing to take what I am being offered. Wolfe – in his defense he did ask me and I couldn't answer him because I didn't know where we are going with the Sewer Plant. I asked Bryan and he said you can't have him for the water if I need him at the Sewer Plant, so I couldn't give him an answer. Crispin – based on last meeting, I thought he was Sewer and going to learn Water. Council agreed to make McClamroch a floater and to split salary three ways.

Haddix – I think we took away too much from Arrasmith at last meeting. I would like to raise him up to \$18.00 per hour based on him having several years' experience at the Sewer Plant and he has a class 4 license. He knows he needs a class 3 but he has not passed it yet. He was filling out the wrong application so he was not able to get scheduled. My recommendation is to put him at \$18.00. Council agreed to raise Arrasmith with contingency of taking the test by April 1<sup>st</sup>. Haddix - If Arrasmith has not taken the test by April 1<sup>st</sup> he will be looking for a job.

Trickling filter is being built and will be installed the first part of April. I need to figure out the flat rate for a customer here in town that is hooked onto the sewer but not metered water. SK Fence will be here in February to install a gate. It will be paid through the loan money from the previous project. Dan and I met with Matt Johnson yesterday. He will attend a meeting in about a month with more information on the Phase 2 project. Curry construction will be here in the morning to change out the bad gate valve and the bad check valve at the lift station.

#### **COMMISSIONER WOLFE:**

## Wolfe – Tabled water Ordinance

Attorney what does the statute say? Morris - Illinois Statute 65 ICLS 5-3-1-7-57 says if an appointed office resigns, he or she shall remain in office until a successor has been chosen and is qualified. That applies to Clerk and Treasurer. Mayor so we get somebody hired and trained then we can have a special meeting and accept their resignations. Attorney Morris – yes.

## JANUARY 19, 2021

The water bill went to the post office and the post office had an error in getting them delivered. It was not the cities fault the bills were late getting to the customers. We will waive the late fees this month due to this problem. Just a glitch at the post office and they have addressed the problem and gotten it taken care of.

I have a chemical pump acting up at the well. I will try a rebuild kit for \$200 before I spend \$800 to buy a new one.

With the new water line going in I will need a locator. They are about \$4000.
