UNFINISHED BUSINESS: COMMISSIONER CHANEY MOVED AND COMMISSIONER HADDIX SECONDED THAT COUNCIL AUTHORIZES THE FLOCK CAMERAS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,500.00. VOTING AYE ON THE MATTER WERE ALL MEMBERS PRESENT. VOTING NAY NONE. MOTION CARRIED.

DISCUSSION: Mayor Owen – Ambulance got anything? Neal – I want to Thank You for whatever you did a Humrichous’. First time since living in Chrisman that we have not had a flooded basement! Mayor Owen – That is GREAT News! And you know what I don’t know what year it was that they put that tile down through town, but it’s bad and we have replaced several chunks of it. Chaney- Water is flowing, I was just down there today. So, you go up on Indiana Street there is that man hole there you can hear water down there if you can’t see because it dives into the pipe and there is water flowing there and there is a boat load of water in the new man hole you had installed and then further down the street, so. Mayor Owen – I’m glad money we spent is working for you. Neal – Appreciate it. Mayor Owen – Anything else? Haddix – 36” tile there and it was completely full. Neal – That would stop it. Haddix – On another note, my neighbor right there were fisher used to live, the big two-story house, they have water in their basement. They have never had water in their basement before. So, I don’t know what... Chaney

– Well Carolyn Heath stopped me today and she has had water in her basement too. Mayor Owen – Me too. Almost the other end of the city.

Mayor Owen - Shawna you have anything? Boyer – Just wanted to know about the water bills and stuff. If you got that all straighten out or if it still isn't being read right? Mayor Owen – We are working on it. Chaney – There has been some software issues, but I think the software issues has been resolved now...right? Hoskins – And it's still the beginning of the month. Chaney – And then we got some meter that we had replaced the older, I'll say, the older generation of the automated meters. We had to replace some of those. Boyer – I know last meeting you were talking about ordering. Did you get them ordered? Chaney – Yep, that's on my list to talk about there are probably 3 months out. But I think it went smoother this month than it had from previous months. We didn't have as many re-reads and we didn't have as many re re-reads and so it's went smoother and umm...we have some more training coming up later this week. Mayor Owen – Anything else?

Mayor Owen – Tom what do you have? Dolan – Uh not much just wanted to update. I go to the doctor Wednesday for another x-ray and I am on the schedule for Wednesday night we will see if that plays through. Wanted to again Thank the guy's again big props to them for covering all the shifts. Also, I know that you have already approved the purchase of the flock camera and I had information on if you weren't going to do that. So, I was just going to give you an update that you may already have. I don't know but it can be done later. Chaney – Go ahead that will save me from talking. Dolan – And you might have read in the paper that Paris approved 5 and Kansas approved 3. I spoke with Detective Jenkin's today ugh the Edgar County Sheriff's Department said they were ready to approve 5. I also spoke with the Mayor in Hume and it's on the agenda to do one up there. So, I'm glad you guys see the value of doing it. I don't know if it is possible but I would encourage two that way we have both routes to town covered, but I know money is an issue. Chaney – I have a grant for you guys to apply for. Dolan – Yep Chaney – I emailed umm can't remember the guy's name over there at flock. He sent me an email and I forward it to the girls. It has the grant information that he talked about in the meeting in Paris. Dolan – Yep Chaney - It has a web-link in here looks like. Dolan – I can take care of that for you. Um do you know anybody... I don't know if it was a sales pitch or not. This is good timing the increase in April but the cost does go up significantly in April. So, whatever we do now it will be locked in for 4 years. I see this as a vas tool for us. Honestly, the biggest problem is which way to go with it. There are certain cases were coming in we would want and others cases it would be nice to know which way they left. I don't want to talk about the call we had but there was a guy in town that was very suspicious that followed her home. (As he points out Shawna Boyer to his left) But, we were there within a minute of the call. In fact, you may have still been on the phone with us. The guy had already left. It would have been really nice to know which way he went right you know. I'm looking forward to working with it and having the ability to tap into the surrounding communities. I spoke with the Mayor of Hume and he said it is on the agenda for next week for them to consider the purchase of one to cover a little bit further. I do believe the county is going to put one there on 36 to cover this way. And then the question is how do we get both sides of our town covered. Chaney – I saw a map that was in the email that the guy from flock sent ugh the one he showed for Chrisman was actually just north of the high school. But obvious we can do whatever we want locate it anywhere we want. Jeff Voigt did say to talk to him about the location of their 8 that they plan on

putting in. Dolan – I think it's six now. Chaney – is it okay, I know they had a meeting Tuesday and I couldn't make it to Paris. Dolan – yeah, but they may decide to put some here. They are big on benefit too you know if you have to wait till Hume or wait to Newman or wait to the town passed Dana, I always forget of the name of it. Chaney – Montezuma Dolan – Montezuma yeah wait till Montezuma to see. Chaney – Actually the one in Montezuma catches traffic coming east and west, I noticed that Saturday when I was over there. Dolan – Yeah which is good because we will get the alert that they are on their way. That was what I had heard. Chaney – You're right it does go 2500 dollars a year to 3000 dollars a year on April 1st. Mayor Owen – Per Year Chaney – Yes, per year. I did speak from a gentleman from Edgar County Neighborhood Watch and they had mentioned down there that they have some funds that they are trying to figure out how to divvy up that fund between all the different towns or where ever the cameras are going with the county and everything. But ugh it is likely they will make a donation to cover the installation cost per camera once we pick a spot. Mayor Owen – They have 10,000 to disperse. Chaney – It will be, the cost to install will be, ugh a little over 1,000 dollars. Dolan – Yeah, we've got state issues with delays, but I did also speak with someone that is familiar with the IDOT procedures and they said the zone that we have, there is no guarantee, but they believed the approval proses would be quicker in our zone than it might be in one of the other zones. So, it wasn't more of a state level thing as of more of a district thing. So, that was good news that it might be faster. Mayor Owen – Anything else. Dolan – No Sir.

Mayor Owen – Gary Gary Henry – I do have something for you actually for you guys. I went to the town board meeting today and discussed the flock cameras and right now their plan is 6. That could change by Wednesday, but they discussed purchasing six. The main thing I wanted to talk to you about is the study that is going around in the county trying to improve internet. Ugh ever county was picked out by the Illinois Soy Bean Association to look at rural internet to study how much different it is, what we have in a place like Edgar County as opposed to a metropolitan area. So, the group is gathering information and I am hoping that you guys would be receptive of one of your office staff to put up one of these flyers for people to either get the information off their website or use the QR Code. And for the people that don't have internet because they just can't get it, they can stop by my office and get a paper survey that they can fill out. There is no cost to it, it is not a sales pitch it's just to get the information that is necessary to try to formulate a plan that will companies to come here. One of the sub committee's is now in the process of gathering information on companies to interview them to say why don't you come here. And it is not an impossible task. There is so much money out there right now targeting companies as an incentive to put in internet. High Speed Internet I'm not talking about the stuff I've got at home right now that is 4 mega bites down and 3 mega bites up. So, there is that... The other thing I wanted to ask of you is there will be a round table discussion of community leaders and business leaders March 16th at 6:30 pm at the Farm Bureau Building a member of the Benton Institute of Broadband Society will be there and I was hoping that you would be able to send a city representative even if they don't know a lot about internet it's still important that their there and represent Chrisman. Tom if you want to come for safety reasons would be more than happy to have you to. Ramey – I was approached today about it as well. Umm sending someone from the city to that meeting. Henry - Probably Angie Garwood. Ramey – Yes Mayor Owen – Okay, we will send somebody there. Henry – Great Thanks!

Mayor Owen – Anything on the water boy? Haddix – I haven't been able to...

Mayor Owen – Vacated Alley we don't know anything yet.

Mayor Owen – Flock Camera's Haddix – I do need to talk about adjusting the water rate there. Mayor Owen – There where?

Haddix – At the water boy. I had talked to Cory a couple weeks ago. We have never raised the rates there and so I don't know how to go about that. And we need to bump that up to putting another quarter in or turning the timer back so that it doesn't run quit as long. Mayor Owen – How many gallons are we giving them for a quarter now? Haddix – I don't know what it is. Mayor Owen – Well we will have to look at that and see how we can adjust it. Or if that... I thought there was a guy coming? Haddix – No Mayor Owen – He is not coming. Haddix – He is in the state of Kansas. Mayor Owen – He was just going to send us the new guts. Haddix – Yeah Mayor Owen – Then I need the information. We won't know until we get that. Haskins – He was fixing the thing right. Mayor Owen – The coin mechanics. Hoskins – Yeah because it was going to cost mega bucks for a new one. Haddix - It is going to cost a lot if we were to do a digital thing that takes dollars. Mayor Owen – We will cross that bridge when we get a new box.

Mayor Owen – Flock Camera's Chaney – I just need to say that the grant information is there and the girls have it. If you want to fill out so... (handing the papers to Tom Dolan)

NEW BUSINES:

Mayor Owen – So, what do we got on our new meters? Did you say they were three months out? Chaney – What's that now? Mayor Owen – The new meters. Chaney – I think we are half way through ugh the old manual read meters that are leaking out and replacing them. Jason Gore's crew has been up here a couple days and they have gotten 34-35 of them replaced so far so we are half way through and then they are fixing the leaks as well. Mayor Owen – So, the fixed them or replaced them half hour to an hour how long does it take to change one? Chaney – So, the first one took about a half hour the second took about 9 minutes another one they had to kind of dig up around and locate it um took them about 45 minutes. So, it's taking them about 20-25 minutes per meter. Mayor Owen – Good Chaney – They will be on their way back tomorrow to replace a couple more that are leaking. Haddix – He is not getting started until 9 or 10 o'clock most days. Chaney – Yep so, it's not a full 8-hour day but it's they're getting quite a few done. Haddix – They are getting right after it. Chaney – They got some more pvc from Mr. Wolfe the other day for the antennas to fix those. The meters that we talked about purchasing at the last meeting I talked to the guy last Thursday I think it was. He said he can get the nodes here by mid-April but the meters are back ordered until like the first of June. He is going to see if he can expedite that or pull from somewhere else to get them out here but that is the date right now. Um so, that would be another 100+ meters that we would have on the self and then to replace hot rods that are going bad. Crispin – Are they going to be the ME8's? Chaney – Yes Crispin – Which are the newer of what we had. Chaney – Yes, the newest generation. Haddix – These are the ones the antenna you unplug from and you can still use the meter. Crispin - Instead of replacing the whole unit. Haddix – yeah those are a thousand-dollar unit or whatever they are. Chaney – We have Barb coming out Friday to train Lela on driving the route from start to finish. Download the information on the laptop and go out and drive around and collect the

information, watching it as it comes in to make sure that is it coming in right to make sure nothing is wrong, run the reports, come back upload everything to the computer. So, that is happening as well. Mayor Owen – Very good.

Mayor Owen – What about Personal? Chaney – That leads me into I want to bump Lela up two more dollars an hour for taking on this task of the water meters and I want to bump Kaylen up a dollar an hour for everything that she has taken on here at the office. Chaney – So, then the only thing that we would need help with on the meters until we get all of them replaced is one of the guys read the manuals. Which is decreasing every day. We should have around thirty right now. By the end of the week, he might not have any left. To manually read unless there is an issue. Where they go back out and pull it. We also need to really do this preventative maintains that we talk about. Because when Gore went out and replaced a meter here while back it had been leaking for a while. Nobody, I mean, I think this was one that was automated or was it a hot rode. That was over on this street over on this street over here or something (as he points to the north of the city building) that was leaking. Once a quarter or once a month we need to do that. One every route and check the pits to see what is going on. This was an automated and we would not have known what is going until they went out to look at the problem. They have that on their list. It was a big leak on that one so they have that one on their list to fix tomorrow as well as a handful of others. They informed Michael of that as well.

COMMISSIONER CHANEY MOVED AND COMMISSIONER CRISPIN SECONDED THAT COUNCIL APPROVES TO INCREASE THE HOURLY RATE FOR LELA RAMEY TO \$2/HOUR. VOTING AYE ON THE MATTER WERE ALL MEMBERS PRESENT. VOTING NAY NONE. MOTION CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER CHANEY MOVED AND COMMISSIONER CRISPIN SECONDED THAT COUNCIL APPROVES TO INCREASE THE HOURLY RATE FOR KAYLEN HOSKINS TO \$1/HOUR. VOTING AYE ON THE MATTER WERE ALL MEMBERS PRESENT. VOTING NAY NONE. MOTION CARRIED.

Mayor Owen – Okay Storm Sewer Drains. Chaney – I met with an engineer from Fehr Graham last Thursday and Bryan was up here. We talked to him about this forgiveness loan that they have similar for what we did for the water project um I think we qualified for a 45% forgiveness on storm sewer...um upgrade loan. We walk the whole system from east out west. Looked at a couple of other problem areas we have here on Madison Street that was flooded over the weekend um Woodlawn down there. I sent him some pictures over the weekend he has pictures of all the maps that we have of our system and he is doing some analysis, and we played phone tag today and never connected. But he is going to put something together and talk to Andy Keiser and then probably come back down here for a meeting and have a proposal for us. It is going to take some time and it won't happen overnight. It will be several months of going over the red tape even to get everything if we get selected for the grant. But we do have things moving in the right direction. None the less we need some money to repair State Street. Those sink holes over there are getting worse ugh we walked that system and one of the man holes on the corner in front of Madison and State Street is plugged up. So, there is a definite need to find some money to do some major improvements to our system. We did talk about the culvert out here by the nursing home. Crispin – Yeah Chaney – He didn't seem too concerned about it. So, I'm going to talk to Keiser about it. To see if it is actually on the list or to get someone down here to actually look at it.

Crispin – It has been asked to be by an engineer for two three years now. Chaney – More to come but the ball is rolling.

Mayor Owen – Computer Systems Chaney – Do we have any breaks downs on that? Hoskins – It has break downs on like the yearly, because I still need to talk to Barb on exactly how we are going to be on both sides. The Quick Books is relatively simple. But on the other side is where it's kind of... Chaney – We will table it until the next meeting. Barb is our expert we will get answers on Friday.

Mayor Owen – Okay, we got electric bids in here one of them... Chaney – I looked through them and I am going to recommend what Tamera recommends here and stay with AEP for two years and that is around like .07. The other one is Homefield Energy there is some disadvantages and advantages going both ways but she recommends staying with AEP. And I would second that. Mayor Owen – And not going over two years. Crispin – Yeah Chaney – Right yep.

COMMISSIONER CRISPIN MOVED AND COMMISSIONER CHANEY SECONDED THAT COUNCIL AUTHORIZES THE ELECTRIC BID AS PROSED \$0.082800 FROM AEP FOR 24 MONTHS. VOTING AYE ON THE MATTER WERE ALL MEMBERS PRESENT. VOTING NAY NONE. MOTION CARRIED.

REPORTS FROM COMMISIONERS: Mayor Owen – Thad what do you have for us. Crispin – I was hoping this week might get dry enough to get the light pole down on the band stand. Um I had those lights kind of strung up so they would not fly around but of course the monsoon come through and now they are back down. So, hopefully before Friday we can try to get those down, because it is supposed to rain again Friday. Chaney – I will call him again tomorrow. Crispin – Lewsader? Chaney – nods his head yes. Crispin – Okay I can shoot him a text I suppose. Along with Cory's Storm Sewer Drain I talked to Coles County Regional Planning there I saw some for only 30% forgiveness. So, that really isn't going to work if you have got 45%. Chaney – That's what Andy estimated it at. Crispin – I talked to Jeremy Lawson at district 95 he hosts every now and then he a grant writing workshop. So, I'm going to try and get in on that to try and learn this grant writing thing. They seem to be out there so I want to learn how to get them. I am going to look at the landscaping around the flag pole at Centennial Park to see what we can do with that brick. The brick is just falling apart so hopefully we can do something with that.

Mayor Owen – Bryan

Mayor Owen – Cory Chaney – I put in a work order to get catch basin clean. When we took that walk last Thursday a lot of them were covered up and there are still several that are covered up. I had a couple home owners call with their catch basins in their yard were covered up with leaves and debris. 32:17 We need to seriously need to think about getting a jettier and Gore is available with his jettier also his vac truck is back up and running. He will be in the area tomorrow but I do think we need to get some of these man holes sucked out. Some of these lines jettied. We have to get the water flowing in some of these areas. Mayor Owen – Have you heard anything from Paris. Chaney – I did talk to three different commissioners down in Paris and the Mayor traded some emails with some of them also talked to a superintendent and have not heard back. So, I don't know if we need to go to a meeting down there or what. I want to ask that question to set up some type of agreement with them. But I do know that Gore is going to be in Sidell tomorrow with his vac truck and he said he could swing through after he got done

in Sidell. If you want to use him, he is available tomorrow to get started anyway on some of this. Haddix – I check with the rep from Coe Equipment about leasing one and it was very salty \$1500 a day and \$4500 for the week. Mayor Owen – how much are we paying Gore to come? Haddix – He was going to look into using a smaller trailer that way it would be substantially cheaper but... Crispin – I talked to Cody today and anytime he has down time he is supposed to be picking up leaves and stuff as well as getting the curbs cleaned up. Because every time it rains it just dumps full of leaves. So, he is supposed to be doing that. Haddix – They worked a big part of the day cleaning up storm drains on Friday. Chaney – There was a culvert of there by New York Street that was just jettier out you know nice job jettiering it out but on the down side of it all the debris was just left there. So, they didn't really do anything everything was still plugged up at the other end of the culvert. I appreciate the effort but it didn't solve the problem. I met with a guy today on grading and seeding that down there between Indiana and New York Streets and we should have a quote here before the next meeting. We walked the whole job and told him what we needed to do there. The dump road we don't own that road and there is a lot of traffic on that road. And it's pretty nasty it needs some help over there and even the dump around the pile that we have. It needs some rock or something. Mayor Owen – We are going to discuss that here in a little bit. Chaney – Alright Haddix – The railroad is supposed to be putting some more rock on it. Mayor Owen – That was like three weeks ago did they bring it? Chaney – No I haven't seen anything. I didn't know is that a township road. Mayor Owen – Actually that road was for the farmers and we just Malone's own it. Chaney – Right we just have an easement there we don't own it. It's outside city limits. Crispin – Yeah, it's not ours. Mayor Owen – We always have maintained it since we dump there. Chaney – We need some rocks or something. I had some folks call about that over the weekend as well when they were taking stuff up there. Haddix – Put 2" on the east side of it a year or so ago. Chaney – And then when I was over looking at the job out there between Indiana and New York. Carolyn Heath hit me up about, I think she might have talked to you maybe too, on the east side of her house possible bringing in some more fill dirt. The side walk is in bad shape! It pretty much is not existing um but didn't know if she needed to come to a meeting and ask permission to take the dirt and taper it out over the side walk and just cover it up. To get the water flowing. Mayor Owen – Where is this at? Chaney – Over there on the corner of Jefferson and New York. Some of the dirt went from the sewer project to her house. Our guys took a couple loads of some clay dirt over to her house. The guy that is doing the landscaping for her is also doing the landscaping bid for us. He is going to shape it up and the question was if there is not ditch along New York Street so the water comes off the side walk off the road across her yard and then down in the valley where we set that new man hole in. Once he gets it all shaped up there really needs to be something there with a ditch going to the man hole that is already in the ditch line or shaping her yard up somehow. Just a question for you guys to look at and think about. Can she do that or are we willing to allow her to do that and then what do we need to do. Haddix – I talked to her about it a couple weeks ago I was over there. Possibly we could take some of that off of the top and then grade the rest of it off and it be a lot less slight of an angle. She could maintain it that way a little easier. Chaney – Because you are looking at a straight line about 2.5 feet of dirt to come in there and fill that off so it is actually reasonable. Then it keeps the water flowing in the ditch line where it needs to be. So that is all I have.

Mayor Owen – Girls you got anything?

Chaney – Oh, nope sorry I have one more thing! The water report so, we don't have gallons at the tower but we do have the number of gallons sold. And the number of gallons that we bought from Paris. But anyway, I know we had a lot of leaks in the last two months. One had 14,00 gallons one month another 15,000 gallons one month that leak has been fixed. We got 60,000 gallons leak in Woodlawn last month. Um that's not including what the amount of usage on that leak plus having the fire hydrants open down there during that time so we will have another loss in the month of February. We are -20,000 for the month of January. Um... We did have positive in the month or December of 1700 dollars. Hopefully getting some of these leaks fixed and fixed right is going to help us in going forward but we are already starting out the year in the hole.

Mayor Owen – Okay, let's call executive meeting.
