Mayor Moore – So I have a question on that. Is that the story walk that you’re talking about?

Commissioner Jordan – That’s what I thought it was. Mayor Moore – Okay we decided that it might be better to put them around the bandstand. And it’s no cost to the city. It won’t be done until the winter or spring next year.

COMMISSIONER HOULT MOVED AND COMMISSIONER JORDAN SECOND THAT COUNCIL AUTHORIZES THE BACK HOE TO HAVE THE HYDRAULIC CYLINDERS REPLACED AT MARTIN EQUIPMENT. VOTING AYE ON THE MATTER WERE ALL MEMBERS PRESENT. VOTING NAY NONE. MOTION CARRIED.

Mayor Moore- Shawna? Boyer – The community club wants to know if it will still be okay to use the pavilion during Chrisman Days? Another question was can we store a refrigerator in the concession stand area for continence’s sake? I know that we got voted down last year and so we just want to know if we can leave it there unplugged? Except obviously when someone is there. Mayor Moore – I was going to talk to the insurance company about that tomorrow. I don’t see why that would be a problem. If we got it, we might as well use it. I’m sure we can get something typed up that says as long as a theft or no electricity to it the we are not liable for it. I will just have to get back to you sometime tomorrow.

REPORTS FROM COMMISIONERS: Commissioner Hoult – everything is going pretty well. We have built some screens to go around those pumps to keep them from burning up. Also, we have been working on the lines that take the um... chlorine to the pit. This way we can run our own chlorine and it will be a lot cheaper. It will just take some time and we will get it done. The pumps have been back dated again so. Commissioner Chaney – Have they checked with any other venders to see if there are others that might have these pumps. Commissioner Hoult – Yes, I think so. Commissioner Chaney - I have had other vender that have told me that those pumps are available. Commissioner Hoult – I wonder if we have paid on some of that or... Commissioner Chaney – I think so or some of it. Like the boring out to the plant I know we paid a portion of that. Hoskins- Two Requests. Commissioner Chaney- There is something in the contract and I know there are delays but, there is a schedule in there and once they hit a certain date, they have to paying us because they missed the finished day. It could be that Fehr Graham since they are the construction manager on the job, did they pushed that out for the contractor, or what is going on

there. Or what is going on there. Commissioner Hoult – They keep putting us back all the time. Commissioner Chaney – then that delays the bid process for phase 2. Hoult – Yes. Mayor Moore- and prices keep going up.

Mayor Moore – Water Accounts? Ramey – I have one for you to review it was on your clip boards. They don't have any leaks and it has been consistent over the months until this last bill. Then it goes up 3,000 gallons. Commissioner Chaney – Do you know what meter that is? Ramey – It is a hotrod. Chaney – It probably needs replaced. Ramey – I would say so. Chaney – Do you want me to call the plumber and see if he can replace that tomorrow? Council was in agreeance.

Mayor Moore – We have contacted with where the portable restrooms are going to be around the square for Chrisman Days. There will also be two at the Centennial Park. Now the light towers I don't know much about them. Chaney – I don't know anything about the lights just the portable restrooms. Jordan – I had a thought about when we take the poles down around the baseball field and using a generator to fuel them which would be cheaper. Chaney – The problem is that we didn't have a bum truck that was tall enough.

Mayor Moore – I have a quote for the Epps building to be repainted. There are some leaks in that building and this quote is to power wash the front and back and sides. Then paint the building with asphalt aluminum paint and paint the front white. The quoted price includes all material, labor, with an eight-year warranty and a yearly inspection. At \$7,000 Chaney – I think they need to look at their budget and verify that it is not lead paint first. Then we can decide on it.

Mayor Moore – Jordan do you have anything? Jordan – The only thing I got was Zimmerly's and they do not have the correct silent for that salt building. But they got ahold of the sales man and got me hooked up with a person out of Champaign on White Cap and I just gave Dan that information. He will go pick up a 5-gallon bucket of that when he has time. That way we can take care of it our selves for under \$500 dollars. Council in agreement.

Mayor Moore – Bob do you have anything? Hoult – Not any more than I said. Mayor Moore – Cory what do you have? Chaney – Well, I have missed a few meetings so my notes here are rather long. Dumpster Days. Do we have a set date and dumpster reserved for that? Hoskins – They won't pick up on weekends so we need to move it to Wednesday and Thursday or just find somebody else. Chaney – How many dumpsters did we go through last year? Hoskins – 7 I believe. Jordan – So I would just change the date then it would be the easiest way. Ramey – Before or after Chrisman Days because that is the weekend. Mayor Moore – A lot of the time people have their garage sale and then want to get rid of the stuff if it doesn't sell. Jordan – I say after. Chaney – Yep. Hoskins I will make it the week after. Chaney – The 80 remanding water meters. So, the guy from Muller said they have already shipped. I heard that MCO doesn't have them but the girls checked and they do have them. Hopefully they will get here by the end of the week. So, we can replace 35 right now but we need an inventory and see how many manual meters and how many hotrod meters then look and see if we need to order more. And have a few on the self for anything that happens. The water main going to the sewer that busted and then they repaired it about a month ago. I saw Jason late last week with Lankster and Gore um That line would need to be up sized from a 2" line to a 3" line. Material would be about 2 thousand dollars and then depending on boring it or trench it is what Gore really wants to know. My opinion is boring but there is a cost different is. I think Michael had asked him to put some type of flush hydrant there so they could use a hose on some tanks and stuff. So that would include the hydrant as well. Another thing is had we flushed hydrants yet because we need to be doing that. Hoult – I don't think so. Mayor Moore – I have asked

Michael about that and he said he does that about once a month. Chaney – I had asked Jason quit a time ago to give us a quote on moving the water boy from Washington street to up here by the water tower. It would save us about 3,000 a year. Question for you Dan. Has Michael been able to suck out enough sludge to do a sewer sample? Hoult – Yes, he has, but now that water boy thing down at the tower we would have to fix a road for them trucks to get turned around and that is going to be some cost. Chaney – Well it would save us about 500 per month to send that sludge down there to Paris. Yes, Bob it would however there is some old pipe down there and now they are in that grass by they building that need moved to do a road. Umm...I got an email from where we got our Christmas light at last year and I am going to look at my budget to purchase some but I will have to bring it to meeting for approve because it will be past my budget. Then I passed along a contractor that does hand rail and need to pass that on to you. (Pointing to Jordan) Tereasa Jordan – Do you remember the rail on that bridge over the creek to the park is still bent. That might be something to keep in mind as well. Chaney – Well that is all I've got.

REPORTS FROM MAYOR: Most of you know Tom's son has been in critical condition and Steve has been taking over these passed few weeks. Steve Hall – He is doing better. Hopes are he will make some long strides in the next week. Moore – Okay that is great news. Alright we have a tree list of some that needed taken down. And I don't know where we are with that. I don't know how much money we have. Hoskins – We used all that money to clean up from the storm. Moore – Okay waiting on FEMA then. There is a light out on the basketball court and when talking to Rick Jennes, he said it would be best that we put LED lights in there. Jordan – Agreed. Mayor Moore – He also said that there might be a program for the light at Centennial around the baseball field. Chaney – Ameran is not so graceful. Duke Energy will do that program and have that available for people. However, Ameran does not unfortunately. Mayor Moore – I want to thank Brice Stratton for the Baseball field! It looks amazing and it was all volunteer work and planning on his part we had nothing to do with that. Chaney – Yes it does. Mayor Moore – And with that, that is all I have.
