DISCUSSION:

Ambulance:

Angie Martinez:

I came for the library, the community garden has become a jungle back there. My husband and I were actually going to go there tomorrow and clean it all up if that's ok. Mayor Owen- That would be great. Martinez- We were told that we had to get permission. Mayor Owen- As long as you save the Holly Hocks. Martinez- We've got a garden box there and

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went yesterday and it's gotten pretty bad. Bohle- It is not getting mowed? Martinez- I don't think so, it's gotten so bad I wouldn't let my daughter go back in there. Where should we put the left-over mess. Mayor Owen- You can put it there at the back. Thank you.

Chief Dolan:

I'm still waiting on a list of cars. We have contacted the notorious one, and it has been hauled off. Also, the house on Madison is now vacant. It's still an on-going saga, issues with some stuff. The owners are supposed to be getting a dumpster coming in. Mayor Owen- Well that's good news. Martinez- Have they been coming back? Dolan- There has been reports that that has happened, but not evidence that it has. Martinez- I was told that they have been frequently coming back, I didn't know if it was true or not. Dolan- We don't know that. Chaney- I've had some people say that they've seen them walking down alleys and streets in the middle of the night. Mayor Owen- Recently? Chaney- Like a week ago. Dolan- My gut tells me no. We do a lot of patrolling at night, and we investigated a few of the reports that have been made. Mayor Owen- You've done a good job. Wolfe-A lady had called with some concerns. Dolan- The lady with the fireworks? Yeah sure, we had a report Sunday that the early fireworks had put debris all over her yard, roof, and car. She was concerned that they kind of pointed it all at her. I went and talked with her Sunday Morning. I've checked the Ordinance book and I didn't see anything in there about fireworks. Mayor Owen- I don't think we have one, the only ordinance would be the state. Dolan- It might be something we can put out next year, maybe some guidelines next year when it comes time.

Insurance for Water Project:

Wolfe- Believe it or not I'm still waiting on the insurance. All right, our insurance company turned up down for the 10-million-dollar umbrella policy. If we end up getting it, it will cost us anywhere from 5 to 6 thousand more a year from now until forever on our insurance. I called my engineer today and said let's quit with it. So, we can go ahead and jump ahead and talk about it now.

Pay Application:

Mayor Owen- This is a request for our loan disbursement, then they will send us our money.

FS Bill:

Crispin- We've got the final bill, the Pavilion is done they're in \$108,980, I'm pretty sure that is what the bid was. Their end is done, I'm still waiting on stuff.

Fire Department Requests:

Crispin- I marked off the bucket truck. Mayor Owen- We can't let them use that, but everything else is good right.

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Property for Water Building:

Wolfe- We need to make a decision. I call the engineer today and he said we need to wait and see what the railroad says, if they'll give us forgiveness for the insurance but they are not wanting too. We are at a total stand still. Crispin- Because of the railroad? Wolfe- I told my engineer today why don't we use our 18" sleeve that we already have under the railroad. He never thought about it. Or do we right off what we spent on the concrete and just buy the property south of the tracks. If you guys let me ill dig and see what we've got there. Chaney- You can dig there without issues from the railroad. Wolfe- Yeah, I'm aloud so many feed, and sure that sleeve is on my property. If it can't be done then at the next meeting we need to go ahead and make a move on it. We've got water to the intersection but I haven't taken it over yet. I've got people asking when they can go ahead and turn It on. While we are on the subject, I think you've got a notice from Fehr Grahm to pay them for some sewer work, well it's been over a month or two since I've said something about water rates. I thought Brian was going to meet with him. Mayor Owen- I talked to Matt Johnson today, since it was been awhile. He said he's called Brian without an answer and hasn't called him back. Wolfe- I'm not for paying him until I get something done with these water rates. Crispin- I thought we were going to discuss this 3 or 4 meeting ago.

Commissioner Crispin:

We've got bid set out for Tar and Chip, it opens the 15th. Still waiting on the engineer to come down and look at the culvert tile on Washington down by the nursing home. I turned in an application the Edgar County Community foundation for a grant last week. They won't be having a meeting this month, so it will be August.

Commissioner Haddix:

Commissioner Wolfe:

People want to know about a couple houses about why that haven't gotten letters about they've got 60 days to respond to the city to tell us what they are doing. They figure somebody is going to let them go to taxes this go around so we need to be on it. Send them letters. I contacted USIC that's a locating service they charge by the locate so it might end up costing me only 3 or 4 thousand then the monkey is on their back if someone breaks anything. I also need to start flushing hydrants but I've got my guy tied up with the brush the last few weeks. I am not getting any meters put in also. I've got somethings I need done, but there is a lot of brush.
